The Local Government Management Association is pleased to announce the *Municipal Administration Training Institute School for Statutory Approving Officers*, to be held at the South Thompson Inn and Conference Centre in Kamloops from October 19 to 24, 2014.

This week long residential program will provide participants with a comprehensive review of the duties and responsibilities of the Statutory Approving Officer along with best practices for carrying on this function.

Accommodations and meals are provided for participants.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS: You are eligible to attend MATITM - School for Statutory Approving Officers if you work in a BC local government or First Nations jurisdiction and are the Statutory Approving Officer, Deputy Approving Officer, or the primary person responsible for the evaluation of subdivision applications in your organization. Participation from provincial approving officials will be considered subject to space limitations. Registration will be accepted on a first-come, first-served basis to a maximum of 45 students.

COST: Fees are \$1,900.00 plus 5 % GST. This includes tuition, meals, accommodation, materials, and supplies. Fees are payable by September 27, 2014. **Refunds** will be accepted until September 26, 2014, subject to a \$50 administration fee. <u>After September 27, 2014 there are no refunds</u>, however registration is transferable.
