Join us for an exciting opportunity to reflect on and reinvigorate your public involvement techniques by learning about and participating in *The Future Game*. This innovative community engagement tool was developed in Australia and has been used for over a

decade in North America, Australia and Europe. This fast-paced simulation game helps people improve strategic planning, speed up decision-making, and increase collaboration within teams and groups. The game is set in a hypothetical region, with the players taking on the roles of decision makers for the region; it guides participants through a series of critical decisions that will have an impact on the future in very specific and measurable ways.



The game can be used as a powerful tool to stimulate debate and discussion about the future, and to build Future Intelligence. It creates an enjoyable and challenging environment for engagement and participation in discussions about the future. Following completion of the game, an interactive session will be facilitated between the participants to discuss the outcomes of the game, how it integrates within planning processes and can be used with other planning tools. David Beurle, creator of the tool and CEO of Future iQ Partners, will lead the session along with local biologist Lehna Malmkvist.
