Richard Bullock – Chair of the Agricultural Land Commission The Value of the Agricultural Land Reserve

Mr. Bullock has made substantial contributions to the agricultural community in BC. As Chair of the ALC, he has implemented several changes contributing to the preservation of agricultural land to encourage farming. Mr. Bullock has also worked with multiple stakeholders and levels of government to support the use of agricultural land for farm use. Mr. Bullock will speak to the value of agricultural land and the ALR, provide an update of ALC activities (and possibly Bill 24), and speak to the importance of using qualified professionals for ALC applications.

Dr. Lenore Newman – Canada Research Chair (Tier II) in Food Security and Environment The Social and Cultural Benefits of Local Agriculture

In addition to her position of Canada Research Chair, Dr. Newman is Director of the Agriburban Research Centre and Associate Professor at the University of the Fraser Valley. Her multiple research projects include documenting regional foods in Canada, assessing environmental threats, and examining food security concerns at the local, regional, and national levels. In the Lower Mainland, she has focused on local impacts of climate change and it's bearing on food production and distribution; changes to the agricultural and environmental landscape to demonstrate the economic realities and impacts of agriculture on the local community; and, is documenting the evolution of the ALR and land excluded from protection.

Mark Robbins P. Ag. – Agricultural Economist The Economic Benefits of Agriculture

Mr. Robbins spent 25 years as a Regional Agrologist for the BC Ministry of Agriculture where he authored several publications including *An Estimate of the Public Amenity Benefits and Ecological Goods Provided by Farmland to Local Communities in the Fraser Valley* and *BC's Food Self-Reliance Report*. He also participated

in the business development unit of SmartFarmBC and has owned and operated his family poultry farm for the last 10 years. Mr. Robbins will detail the how the agricultural community contributed to a healthy economy.

With a Masters in Economics, Mr. Robbins worked diligently to showcase the importance of the agricultural industry to the local economy. His work helped develop the Abbotsford Agricultural Strategy developed by the City of Abbotsford to protect agricultural lands. In addition to this, Mr. Robbins started K & M Farms with his family over 10 years ago. They produce pasture-raised turkey and chickens in the Abbotsford area

Ken Nickel, P. Ag. – BC Ministry of Agriculture, Director of the Sector Development Branch What is the Province Doing to Support the Agriculture Industry?

In his current position with the Sector Development Branch, Mr. Nickel leads and supports a group of dedicated professionals including industry specialists and regional agrologists in promoting the sustainability of the agriculture sector throughout BC. They provide front-line contact between the Ministry and the agri-food industry, local governments and other agencies to foster agri-food economic development opportunities. Mr. Nickel will discuss programs implemented by the provincial government to improve the marketability of the agriculture sector.

Ron Charles P. Ag. - Event Chair

Mr. Charles will bring his expertise to chair this event. His dedicated service to the agricultural community started with the BC Ministry of Agriculture as a financial analyst in Victoria before moving to Abbotsford in the roles of District Agriculturalist and Senior Agrologist. Mr. Charles was then appointed as Regional Manager for the South Coastal Region, where he was responsible for industry development programs. Following his retirement from the Ministry, he served as Chair of the BC Turkey Marketing Board.
