About the BCSLA

- Incorporated in 1964, under the *Architects (Landscape) Act* and the *Societies Act*.
- Federation of provincial associations, with CSLA as the national association (similar to PIBC & CIP et al.).
- **890** = Total Membership (Feb 2025)
 - 416 = Registered Landscape Architects (Use of Seal/Stamp)
 - 16 = Landscape Architects (No Use of Seal/Stamp)
 - 243 = Interns & Pre-Interns
 - 60 = Inactive
 - 55 = Retired (should they be included?)
 - 36 = Students (should they be included?)
 - 64 = Affiliates

Our PGA Journey

Nov 2018 – PGA received Royal Assent

Dec 2018 – Regulatory Review Task Force (RRTF), member engagement & research begins

July 2021 – application submitted to OSPG

July 2022 – OSPG issues Designation Intentions Report; RRTF dissolved, PGA-Working Group created

Oct 2022 – letter from Attorney General with their recommendation

Present Day – lots and lots of work...

Apr 2025 – letter from Minister confirming government's commitment

Jan 2027 – target date for official transition

Strategic Considerations

- Culture Shift (hint: it's not about you, anymore)
 - Public & registrants
 - Staff & board of directors
 - Government & PIBC
- Impacts on Operations, Registrants & Employers
 - Others will tell you "Costs will go up!"
 - How does this affect my ability to put food on the table?
- Advocacy
 - Yeah, but no... but maybe... I don't know, it depends!

Thoughts & Advice

- The PGA is not a magic wand
 - There's more work to do if you want more
- Know your “haters”
 - UBCM & LGMA could be strong allies
- Unintended consequences
 - Could filing a complaint stall a development?
