The Executive Director will have the opportunity to influence the strategic direction of the organization, while always being guided by the values of the Skwxwú7mesh Úxwumixw. Working closely with a wide variety of external partners, the Executive Director must consistently connect with colleagues and members to ensure they are accurately representing the Nation's vision, beliefs and ideals.
